Who is eligible?

- Parent or sponsor of a student attending Loyola Academy High School.
- Applicant must be a U.S. citizen.
- Applicant and/or co-applicant must meet minimum credit criteria.

Generous Loan Limits

- A family may borrow up to the total cost of education.
- The minimum loan amount is \$2000.
- Low interest rates.

Disbursement Made Simple

- Loan funds are sent directly to Loyola Academy each semester on scheduled due dates.

Financial Aid: Facts You Should Know

Thinking about applying for financial aid? This brochure is designed to walk you through the financial aid application process step by step—and inform you about important dates and deadlines.

It is Loyola's mission to promote and maintain a diverse student body—composed of young women and men from a wide range of cultural, ethnic, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Our financial aid program is an important part of that mission—making our college preparatory curriculum available to a more diverse student population than ever before.

We make the process as smooth and simple as possible—so that more students from every Chicago-area community can enjoy the benefits of a Jesuit education.

Financial aid is awarded to qualified students on the basis of financial need and is offered in the form of gift assistance.

Financial Aid and Diversity

This school year Loyola Academy is awarding over \$3.75 million in scholarships based on financial need. The recipients of these awards are as diverse as our student body. There is no standard formula for determining an award. Each case is considered individually. More than 25 percent of our student population will be receiving financial aid. The average scholarship award is \$5,950.

Our recipients live in Chicago and over 25 suburbs, including Lincolnshire, Evanston, Glenview, Mundelein, Wheeling, Park Ridge, Wilmette and Winnetka, to name a few.

A family of five from Chicago with an income of \$179,161 received \$4,000 in financial aid for two students attending Loyola Academy.

A single mother from Glenview with an income of \$53,014 received \$8,000 in financial aid for one student attending Loyola Academy.

During the 2009-2010 school year, Loyola Academy is awarding a total of \$3.75 million in financial aid.

A family of six from Evanston with a total income of \$84,868 received \$21,000 in financial aid for two students attending Loyola Academy.

A single mom with an income of \$115,866 received \$3000.00 in financial aid.

Don't miss these important dates and deadlines:

JANUARY 9, 2010

Entrance exam for eighth-grade students interested in attending Loyola Academy. Financial aid applications will be given to every student taking our exam.

FEBRUARY 5, 2010

All financial aid application forms, 2008 W-2 forms and 2008 income tax returns must be received by **FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment** by February 5. Your file cannot be processed if any of the requested information is missing or incomplete.

MARCH 11, 15, 18, 2010

Incoming freshmen conferences are held. Tentative financial aid awards will be available at this time to families that have submitted their application to **FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment** by February 5.

MARCH 23, 2010

Your registration fee of \$150 (for freshmen and transfer students) and a tuition deposit of \$450 are due on this date, along with registration information. Incoming freshmen must also submit their program recommendation forms by this date.

APRIL 15, 2010

Deadline for submitting your 2009 W-2 and 2009 income tax returns. Copies should be sent to: Financial Aid Office, Loyola Academy, 1100 Laramie Avenue, Wilmette, Illinois 60091-1089.

MAY 28, 2010

Final financial aid awards will be granted to all qualified students.
